If someone you know has Down syndrome and is 30 years or older:

He or she may be eligible to participate in a research study designed to enhance our understanding of the causes of Alzheimer's disease and other diseases that cause memory and thinking problems, and to potentially uncover new approaches to treating these diseases.

This study will involve one visit per year to the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora, CO.

During each research visit, the participant will:

- Receive a physical/neurological exam.
- Answer questions about their health history.
- Have medical records reviewed.
- Have a study partner (family member, caregiver, or close friend) help complete questionnaires.
- Provide a blood sample.
